

ANN ST. HILARIE JUNIOR BOWLING TRAVELING SCHOLARSHIP TOURNAMENT

\$15.00 PER TOURNAMENT (HANDICAP ONLY)

\$20.00 FOR BOWLERS IN HANDICAP AND SCRATCH

This shall be a traveling type tournament, whereby each bowling center recognized by the Greater Roanoke Area USBC Association. There shall be one tournament at each of the participating Roanoke Area USBC Association centers and a final tournament. The features of this tournament are the awards. These shall be in the form of scholarships to be given as a result of the final tournament. 100% of scholarship fees returned to junior bowlers.

All participants must be sanctioned USBC bowlers, and a CURRENT MEMBER in good standings in a league.

No abusive language, body gestures or physical abuse towards bowling equipment or bowlers will be allowed or any bowling equipment of clothing with slogans representing foul language, sex, alcohol, or tobacco products. No hats or headgear. Bowler in such cases will be disqualified immediately. Tournament fees will not be returned for disqualification.

Bowlers must use his or her highest current sanctioned average (minimum of 6 games) for the first time bowling. After bowling, their first tournament bowlers will establish a tournament average. Then each month a composite average (league average plus tournament average divided by 2) will be used. All bowlers must have a league secretary verified average at each tournament. Any bowlers without this verification will be ineligible to bowl. NO PHONE CALLS WILL BE MADE FOR VERIFICATION. (IT WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF YOUTH OR COACH TO BRING IN AN AVERAGE VERIFICATION).

One group shall consist of male and female youth 12 years and younger. The other group shall consist of male and female youth 13 years and older. Ages are based on August 1, 2009. Their will not be an age requirement for the scratch division. There must be a minimum of 6 bowlers signed up to have this division prior to the start of the tournament. Bumper bowlers are not eligible.

Each bowler shall bowl 3 games. The top 5 bowlers shall advance to a stepadder roll-off in each of the handicap groups. There will not be a roll-off in the scratch division. How you finish will be the standing.

Each center tournament shall give \$100 to the first place winner in each handicap age group and \$50.00 to the second place winner in each handicap age group. Certificates will be given out for 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> places in each handicap age group. The winners of the scratch division will receive \$50.00 for first and \$25.00 for second. As this division grows so will the payout. Youth with the most points at the end of the tournament (one male and one female in each age group) excluding scratch division, will also receive a \$100.00 scholarship pending on funds available.

Handicap shall be based on 90% of 200 for all bowlers

All ties shall be broken by a ninth and tenth frame roll-off with handicap.

All bowlers not available to bowl at scheduled times will not be allowed an entry. The final tournament will decide the winners of scholarships. Eligibility for the final tournament will be based on an achieved point system. Points will accumulate at each tournament. 15 points are required for final tournament.

Point System (awarded at each non-final tournament)

First place -----15 points	Fourth place ---9 points	Seventh place ----3 points
Second place --13 points	Fifth place -----7 points	Eighth place -----1 point
Third place ---11 points	Sixth place -----5 points
